Description of change/improvement that would impact fair registration outcomes:

The Council of the College adopted the updated national entry-to-practice competencies developed by the Federation of Dental Hygiene Regulators of Canada. The updated competencies will be used as a benchmark for the National Dental Hygiene Certification Examination in 2026. Canadian dental hygiene programs will also be revising their curriculum in preparation for the impending changes. The College initiated a review and update to its jurisprudence education examination questions, which had not been fully updated since 2016. The old examination questions will be retired in 2023 and replaced with a new set of questions, currently under development. There is no change to the requirement for applicants to complete the jurisprudence examination, which retains the same format.

Q4 Assessment of qualifications	Yes, Description of change/improvement that would impact fair registration outcomes: The Canadian Performance Examination in Dental Hygiene (CPEDH) is a practical examination that measures clinical competency in dental hygiene required of applicants who did not graduate from an accredited dental hygiene educational program. In 2021, the College transferred its share of ownership (intellectual property) in the CPEDH to the National Dental Hygiene Certification Board, which subsequently amalgamated with the Federation of Dental Hygiene Regulators of Canada. The Federation will now be responsible for the ongoing administration and future development of the CPEDH.

Description of Change/Improvement that would impact Fair Registration Outcomes:

In 2020 several dental hygiene programs modified their graduation requirements due to the closure of dental hygiene clinics in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. In light of these restrictions, the College asked Ontario dental hygiene programs to provide an update on the graduation requirements for their 2021 graduates who completed their programs since the last update they provided in 2020. The Registration Committee reviewed all modifications to ensure that graduates sufficiently demonstrated clinical competency prior to graduation. This approach is consistent with the approach being applied by all provincial dental hygiene regulators across Canada. There is a reciprocal agreement between the provinces to accept the assessments completed by the province where the dental hygiene program is located. While adjustments were made in all educational programs in keeping with public health restrictions, there were no changes to the clinical competencies expected of graduates.
