Description of change/improvement that would impact fair registration outcomes:

The CDHO initiated a review and update to its jurisprudence education examination questions in 2021, which had not been fully updated since 2016. This process continued throughout 2022, including the drafting and pilot-testing of new examination questions. The old examination questions were retired and replaced with a new set of questions in 2023. There is no change to the requirement for applicants to complete the jurisprudence examination, which retains the same format.

2022 Fair Registration Practices Report Q5 Yes, Description of change/improvement that would impact fair Registration and assessment fees registration outcomes: In June 2022, Council approved amendments to the CDHO's Bylaws to eliminate an increase to registration fees that had been previously scheduled to take effect in 2023. At the same time, Council approved shifting the annual renewal deadline from January 1 to December 1 (of the year proceeding the year to which the renewal applies.) This shift was designed to increase renewal operational efficiency, as it moved the renewal deadline to a time when the full complement of CDHO staff is available to assist registrants and that is outside of the December holiday period. Q6 Yes, Description of change/improvement that would impact fair Resources for applicants registration outcomes: A full review of the registration content on the CDHO website was conducted in 2022 identifying areas for improvement. The CDHO has contracted the services of a third-party provider to assist with the updating and streamlining of information made available to applicants and registrants on the CDHO website. The CDHO embarked on a project in 2021 to streamline its application process for new registrants to improve processing efficiency. As part of this initiative, the CDHO has been moving towards a fully online application, without the need for applicants to submit supporting documents in hard copy. These changes have been implemented gradually in 2022 as the CDHO updates its application materials and online application portal.

Description of Change/Improvement that would impact Fair Registration Outcomes:

IIn 2022, the CDHO Council, including those members who serve on the Registration Committee, and CDHO staff engaged in the following activities with our system partners that supported learning and understanding of the lives and experiences of the Indigenous peoples of Canada: - In February 2022, both staff and Council participated in a workshop offered by the Canadian Centre for Diversity and Inclusion aimed at debunking myths about Indigenous communities in Canada and providing an understanding of ways of engaging with Indigenous communities. - At their September Council meeting, CCDI and facilitator Roy Pogozelski provided further education about the opportunity to build solid relationships with Indigenous communities. Mr. Pogozelski has been contracted by the CDHO to assist in the development of the CDHO land acknowledgement and to consult with us on Indigenous matters. - On the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, the CDHO Council and Staff were invited to participate in a Virtual Blanket Exercise by the College of Denturists of Ontario. This experiential workshop explored the relationship between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples in Canada. - The CDHO researched providing all registrants with access to an Indigenous education module which will be available in 2023.

The change in the renewal deadline resulted in administrative complexities such as misunderstanding of the required deadline, and the requirement for renewal for new registrants during Q4. The CDHO provided extensive communication to registrants regarding the change and provided increased staff and IT support.

The potential risk of forgery of verifying documents now that original hard copies are no longer required to be notarized and submitted by mail. The CDHO continues to require that verifying documents such as certificates of standing and transcripts from educational institutions be submitted directly by the issuing body to the CDHO. This significantly minimizes the risk of forgery.
